You can either complete the questions as you read or complete the questions after reading the entire book. You should write your child's answers to the questions on the work sheet. This should be a fun opportunity to combine reading with a discussion about valued character traits. **Your child must bring the completed work sheet to the teacher on the first day of school!!** The students will be working with this information and the book you chose during the first week of school. It is very important for you and your child to read a book over the summer and complete this assignment so that he/she will be able to be an active participant in the projects associated with the reading. PLEASE make sure that your child is prepared to share his/her ideas and book!!!!
